If interested in being considered for a part-time teaching opportunity with the Department of Criminal Justice, please submit a cover letter, current curriculum vita / resume, and the names and contact information of three academic references. The cover letter should indicate the course(s) you are interested in teaching and your expertise for teaching the course(s). For courses numbered 1000--5000, the minimum educational level requirement is a Master's degree in criminal justice (or closely related field) or, for legal courses, a JD with relative work experience with a criminal justice agency. For 6000 level courses, a Ph.D. in criminal justice (or a closely related field) or, for legal courses, a Ph.D. in criminal justice (or a closely related field) is required.
